Extra! Extra!

Part four of an on-going series about memories of our neighborhood from the old days.

The kids of Cheviot each made his mark in the professional world by starting with a paper route. There were the morning Times which were not delivered by the locals, but the afternoon paper was the Evening Herald (later merging with the Examiner) and the Mirror. The paper route action started at Pico and Overland where the regional distributor dropped off the papers for the route. The paper boy then had to fold the flat printed papers into throwable form. That sometimes took the form of a double fold with a rubber band but more often an origami fold into itself. When the papers were in the fold mode they were packed into the knapsack on the back for a bicycle ride to the route assigned by the regional distributor. The papers were then thrown onto the driveways, porches, or sometimes just the sidewalk. At the end of the month the paper boy had to collect personally for the papers delivered. That was an adventure, because there were not bills or invoices, just a knock on the door asking for the payments. You were lucky if 40 to 50% paid up since many claimed they had not ordered or were never around when it came time for

the collections. This went on for a few months so that the actual net take of the paper deliverer was never very much but it was always a good experience for the real world of commerce.

During the late 40's before Salk came up with a vaccine the scourge of the neighborhood was the panic of polio. There were always warnings to avoid crowds or common swimming pools or areas which might harbor the bug. Cheviot Hills was not immune to the disease. It was sometime around 1948 when a big quarantine sign went up on the Nims' house on Glenbarr. Mr. Nims was a fairly well known film editor but it did not protect his younger son Marshall from succumbing to the disease. After many weeks or months the quarantine sign was removed but poor Marshall Nims remained for the rest of his life in a wheel chair having been irretrievably compromised by Polio. Thank goodness for Jonas Salk.

In those days the ladies of Cheviot often gathered in an association called the Cheviot Hills Garden Club. It was intended to promote the beauty of the neighborhood and they did a credible job, but in that era the women self-segregated so if one were not of the right background and persuasion one could not join even if she had a great landscape otherwise.
