into the field of real estate where they've learned about economic values, home ownership, mortgage rates, design ideas, foundation issues, contingencies, disclosures, escrows and easements.



When my brother and I fight over the ball, I ask him to come into the 'solving circle.'" He continues, "Miss Diana has taught me how to give people a chance. When new people come to my team or school, I make them feel welcome. She tells us to never ever lie even if it will get you in trouble. If I forget my homework, I tell my teacher what really happened and face the consequences." Important lessons that these elementary school kids are truly benefitting from.
