My brother and Brady had moved in with my mom in Cheviot Hills while their house in Topanga was being renovated, so the three of them would spend hours talking about the baby; preparing for his arrival, imagining the kind of person he was going to be. Sometimes, in fact many times, there would be no words- she would just smile with excited anticipation, tears in her eyes, just thinking about my brother





becoming a father. One of my mom's strongest motivations to keep fighting her battle against cancer was to be able to welcome this baby with open arms into our family.

Exactly two months to the day after my mother passed away, baby Roberto was born. And he came back to her house with his dads and was as warmly embraced into our family as she had hoped for. There were tears and laughter and excitement and joy- and even though we were all thinking of my mom and missing her so much, knowing how special of a moment this was and feeling heartbroken that she wasn't there to savor it, too- there wasn't sadness. Seeing this baby in my mother's former home and feeling her essence all around us, imagining her excited reactions to every single tiny finger and toe... there wasn't sadness at all. It just felt happy and right and gave us a sincere appreciation for the legacy she left. Because when you happen to be the smartest, most attractive, best behaved, kindest and funniest three week old who lives just two short blocks away from a first time uncle, auntie and three eager cousins- your village has been firmly established. My boys have made it a daily habit to run down to visit Roberto, help give him a bottle and a snuggle or two before running back the two blocks to our

house. If our door opens and we see the front wheels of a stroller pushing in, we know that Roberto and his dads have popped by for a visit. The blessing of living so close is indescribable and this little village within our community feels like a pretty great place to be raised.

### Scout's honor

Part ten of an on-going series about memories of our neighborhood from the old days.

The Boy Scout troop in the old days met at Marshall P Riddick vouth center across from Overland Ave school.

Most of the grade schoolers were anxious to win their merit badges. The scout leader was Vernon Lee whose son Richard was an Eagle and whose wife, Mrs. Lee was the local piano teacher. The scouts went to Jamborees at Camp Josepho and to outdoor encampments at Buckhorn Flats.

When we got a little older some of us left scouting before qualifying for Star or Life or Eagle rank and then attended Pasteur Junior High which was on 18th Street near La Cienega (now known as

LACES). This was before Palms Jr High was built. To make the longish ride to Pasteur we rode the yellow school bus which came for us with stops along Motor Ave.

It was early every morning and in the winter it was plenty cold waiting for the arrival, but aboard the bus was a mini-world of relationships and chatter. Most of the boys would spout baseball statistics and the girls of the bus were all at the hormonal age of reaching puberty but the topics of their conversation were not discernible to those of us only interested in the antics of Broadway Billy Schuster, Frank Kelleher and the other stalwarts of the Hollywood Stars and Los Angeles Angels which at the time was the owned and operated farm team of the Chicago Cubs owned by the Wrigleys and which played in

a ballpark precisely modeled on Wrigley Field in Chicago.

It was down in South LA and has long since been razed although on occasion I would go down there for a game accompanied by Elmer Ammons who was the bat-boy for the Stars and who lived with his mother who was a housekeeper for one of the homes on Forrester.

Anyway, at Pasteur, the biggest event was a period called nutrition. The cinnamon raisin rolls were

stupendous and no matter how hard I look I have never found their equal since. When the bonfire tradition before the Ucla vs USC game was abandoned the rally committee came up with spectacular card stunts which wowed everyone as they spelled out various things all by students holding up colored cards in sequence. It was a difficult and exciting spectacle part engineering and part art, and the person behind it was one of the neighborhoodadjacent friends named Peter Artzt. One final note in the passing of things fondly remembered is the fly casting lake above the baseball diamonds at Rancho Park Playground where the water loving dogs of the neighborhood could cavort and where we could sail our pond boats. Why it was removed may have something to do with mosquitos and algae and maintenance costs but I count it as a big shame and a loss.
