It might not feel quite like home yet but the community's outpouring of love and warmth has helped make the transition a bit gentler during such a tumultuous time.

So, this September as the kids are returning to school and you transition to the new schedule that Fall brings, I hope you'll join me in feeling lucky to be living in such a nice neighborhood. There may be disagreements and minor squabbles here and there. An errant golf ball may fly over the fence at Rancho or a driver may take a corner a bit too swiftly but, for the most part, this is an idyllic neighborhood where most everyone knows your name. Cheers to that!


